National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST)

Created in 2007 as part of the America COMPETES Act, the Technology Innovation Program (TIP) at the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) was established "to support, promote, and accelerate innovation in the United States through high-risk, high-reward research in areas of critical national need."

With \$62 million appropriated for the 2008 fiscal year, TIP is aimed at speeding the development of high-risk, transformative research targeted to address key societal challenges. The program will fund small and medium-sized businesses, universities, and research consortia on a competitive, cost-share basis for research on potentially revolutionary technologies for meeting critical national needs that present high technical risks, with commensurate high rewards, if successful.

**Marc Stanley, Director of the Technology Innovation Program**, will brief New York state and local technology and innovation communities on this newly-created partnership program. Details of the program are being determined through the NIST rulemaking process and should be available for public comment early this spring. Marc's talk will outline the strategy and goals for the program from the Director's perspective.
